Azamour Petit Verdot 2008, Alentejo, Portugal	£15.75
<i>What a delightful wine! Lovely plummy aromas and hints of chocolate to the palate. A real steal for your 'cellar'.</i>	
Collioure 2009, Notre Dame des Anges, Roussillon, France	£17.95
<i>The best growers contribute to this special 'cuvée', so the profits can go to restore the vineyard 'terraces. It is a lovely full wine.</i>	
Casas del Bosque Pequena Syrah 2008, Casablanca Valley, Chile	£18.75
<i>Excellent 'New World' Pinot Noir. Fuller and richer than its French relation, but one of the best we have found.</i>	
St. Aubin 1er Cru 'Les Pitangerets' 2008, François Carillon	£18.95
<i>Fran çois, son of a great Burgundy winemaker, is producer equally great wines from often lesser 'parishes. Trust us!'</i>	
Château Tour de Capet 2008, Grand Cru St. Emilion, France	£19.45
<i>Why buy the 'top' property, when their second wine, from the lower slopes, is just as good? This is classically good St. Emilion</i>	
Jordan 'Cobbler's Hill' 2007, Stellenbosch, South Africa	£19.45
<i>A mouthfilling wine with bagfuls of fruit, yet the correct structure to hold it all together.</i>	
Châteauneuf du Pape, Chât. de Vaudieu, Closerie de Vaudieu 2009, Rhone, France	£19.50
<i>Why spend more in these appellation, when you can have this wine? Well structured and accessible, yet with potential to age.</i>	
Coste della Sesia Rosso 'Uvaggio' 2007, Sperino, Piemonte, Italy	£19.75
<i>Similarities to Barolo, but a little lighter and easier to the palate, with lovely aromas and ripe fruit, from a great producers.</i>	
Dominio de Conde 2005, single vineyard Rioja, Bodegas Bretón, Spain	£20.45
<i>A bit of a rarity for Rioja, but it is a wonderful example of the high quality that can be found from this region.</i>	
Zinfandel Reserve 2006, Irvine, Eden Valley, Australia	£20.95
<i>We have added this wine, as it must make the USA winemakers green with envy! So balanced and certainly not 'in your face'.</i>	
Enzo' 2006, Valentin Bianchi, San Rafael, Argentina	£23.95
<i>This is a wonderful Argentine wine from the lovely cooler climate of San Rafael giving a more subtle and complex wine.</i>	
Ribera del Duero 2006, Finca Villacreces, Spain	£23.95
<i>As powerful a Ribera as any with rich aromas and a deep rounded palate. A great example of why one needs to pay for great wines</i>	
Vaja Rosso Veronese 2006, Fabiano, Veneto, Italy	£24.75
<i>Something a different from Verona! The local Corvina blended with Cabernet Sauvignon & Merlot to give a rich and rounded wine</i>	
Taurasi DOCG 2006, Vesevo, Campania, Italy	£25.25
<i>Deep and concentrated colour with aromas and flavours that last for ages. A complete winner.</i>	
Piorat 2007, Mas La Mola, Spain	£25.95
<i>Wow! New to us and what a lovely surprise. Both fruity and spices to nose and a palate that explodes with flavours and continues for ages.</i>	
The Barkly' Durif, Campbell's of Rutherglen, Australia	£26.50
